SUMMARY

30-50% of children have a significant headache by the age of 7 years. Childhood migraine is an under-recognized condition and a different entity related to adult migraine. Headaches in children can be classified as primary and sec- ondary. Sometimes are related to eye problems, however an ophthalmologist should know when to further investigate to diagnose if a significant pathology is covered behind a head- ache. This article reviews the warring symptoms / signs and the possible causes of headaches in childhood.
